- (3) Each applicant will be notified later by postal mail about the time and place of the examination.
- (4) Programs in Public Health Nursing / Midwifery have been provided since the 2014 academic year. Programs in Public Health Nursing / Midwifery are open to only those who have a Japanese nurses' license. For details, see the Japanese version of the 'Admissions Information' document.
- (5) Before submitting any application, anyone planning to apply must discuss their plans with faculty member (a professor or an associate professor) in the Department to which that person plans to apply (see 3. "List of Research Supervisors" below).

2. Application

- (1) All applications must be sent by postal mail.

Your application and required documents must be enclosed in our specified envelope and sent by registered mail.

- (2) Application period

Your application must reach us during the period from Thursday 28 June 2018 through Friday 6 July 2018.

*Envelopes must be postmarked no later than Friday 6 July 2018 and must arrive on or before Tuesday 10 July 2018.

	Curriculum Vitae	The CV should not contain pre-university details (if you transferred to university from a junior college, etc. write the details of the college on the bottom line of the CV section). Applicants who have completed studies outside Japan should fill in the 'Formal education outside Japan' section.
	Employment history	If you cannot write your employment history in the space provided, write 'see attachment' and attach an A4 page outlining your entire work history. This section should include details of full-time positions only.
Application Form (back)	Email	Please make sure that you provide your email address or mobile phone number so that we can contact you in the event of any problems with your application documents.

	Emergency contact	If this is the same as the 'Current address', place a tick (✓) in the box beside 'Same as current address'.

- Applications submitted after the application period (that is, applications postmarked after Friday, 6 July 2018) will not be accepted under any circumstances.

Therefore, please request any necessary school certificates etc. at the earliest possible date. If the certificate(s) are not issued in time, you must contact the Graduate Student Affairs Section in advance (Tel: 03-5841-3309).
