Purpose of Education for Research

The purpose of research training in the Graduate School of Medicine is to promote advanced research that will contribute to breakthroughs in the understanding of the mechanisms of life, to improve health, to contribute to the struggle against disease, and to foster international leaders in all fields of medicine who are outstanding scholars and highly creative researchers.

Admission Policy

- 1. Consistent with the aims described above, for its PhD programs in the Graduate School of Medicine, the University of Tokyo seeks students who have the potential to become international leaders in all fields of medicine through outstanding scholarship and advanced and highly creative research. We seek those who will, as described above, contribute to the understanding of the mechanisms of life, to preventing, curing, and recovering from disease, and to promoting and supporting healthy human development.
- 2. Successful applicants will meet the following criteria.
 - Successful applicants will, having a strong foundation of basic knowledge in medicine, nursing, and health sciences, be able to do creative research aimed at solving problems in health sciences and nursing for the purposes of advancing our understanding of the mechanisms of life; preventing, curing, and recovering from disease; and promoting and supporting healthy human development.
 - Successful applicants will be able to clear a path into the future of medicine, nursing, and health sciences through clear, logical analysis and original thinking, unfettered by conventional concepts.
 - Successful applicants will be able and motivated to become active international leaders in their chosen field, on the basis of advanced knowledge and research skills acquired in graduate school.
 - Successful applicants will have basic knowledge in medicine and health sciences and related fields, and the ability to communicate in English as needed in lectures and seminars.

Each program in the Graduate School of Medicine seeks applicants who have the background needed for that purpose to be fulfilled.

1. Application Qualifications

- (1) Persons who have obtained or are expected or complete a master's or professional degree at the Graduate School of Japanese University by 31 March 2024 (Note 1) (Note 5).
- (2) Persons who have been awarded or are expected to be awarded by 31 March 2024 (Note 5) a master's degree from the National Institution for Academic Degrees and Quality Enhancement of Higher Education (NIAD).
- (3) Persons who have been awarded or are expected to be awarded by 31 March 2024 (Note 5) an academic degree in a foreign country which is equivalent to a master's or professional degree (Note 2).
- (4) Persons who have been awarded or are expected to award an academic degree equivalent to a master's or professional degree after completing a foreign country's postgraduate course at an educational institution in Japan which is designated in the said foreign country's education system and

- specifically designated in Japan by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, by 31 March 2024 (Note 4).
- (5) Persons who have completed a program and received or are expected to receive a degree equivalent to a master's degree by March 31, 2024 (Note 5), from the United Nations University.
- (6) Persons who have completed a course of study at a school overseas, an educational institution designated above in Part (4) of the requirements for eligibility or the United Nations University, and have passed or will have by March 31, 2024 (Note 5) examinations and screenings equivalent to those specified in Article 16-2 of the Standards for Establishment of Graduate Schools (1974 Ministry of Education, Science and Culture Ordinance No. 28), shall be recognized by this graduate school as having abilities at least equivalent to those who have a Master's degree. (Note 3)
- (7) Persons who have graduated from a Japanese university or have completed at least 16 years of academic education overseas, and have undertaken or are expected to have undertaken by 31 March 2024 (Note 5) two or more years of research at a university or research institute in Japan or overseas, and who are deemed by the Graduate School of Medicine based on the results of the said research to have academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a person with a master's or professional degree. (Note 1) (Note 2) (Note 3)
- (8) Persons who have been deemed by the Graduate School of Medicine on the basis of an individual eligibility review as having academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a person with a master's or professional degree, and who are aged 24 years or older on 31 March 2024 (Note 4).
- Note 1: Japanese universities mentioned in Eligibilities (1) and (7) above are universities within the boundaries of Japan and as prescribed in Article 83 of the School Education Law.
- Note 2: Eligibilities (3) and (7) above includes the case of having completed a correspondence program provided by a foreign school of said country while residing in Japan.
- Note 3: Persons who intend to apply for admission under eligibility criteria (6) or (7) above must first undergo an eligibility review, and must therefore contact the Graduate School of Medicine's Admission Office (refer to 6(3) below) and submit designated documents required for the review by Monday, 13 November, 2023.

 Eligibility review result will be notified by Email around Friday, 24 November, 2023.
- Note 4: ① Eligibility criterion (8) above is intended for those who do not fall under eligibility criteria (1) (7) but who have been deemed by the Graduate School of Medicine on the basis of an individual eligibility review to have academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a person who has obtained a master's or professional degree.
 - ② Persons who intend to apply for admission under eligibility criterion (8) above must first undergo an individual eligibility review, and must therefore contact the Graduate School of Medicine's Administration Office (see 6(3) below) and submit the following documents required for the review by Monday, 13 November, 2023. Eligibility review result will be notified by Email around Friday, 24 November, 2023.
 - ③ Persons who are deemed by the Graduate School of Medicine on the basis of an eligibility review to have academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a person who has completed a master's or professional degree program shall be permitted to take the entrance exam upon application.

Note 5: Those who wish for October 2024 entry, consider "30 September, 2024" instead of "March 31, 2024."

2. Admission criteria

- (1) Admission shall be determined based on the results of a primary exam and a secondary exam.
- (2) The primary exam is conducted by foreign-language assessment based on the submission of a TOEFL and document screening.
- (3) The secondary exam is only taken by applicants who pass the primary exam, and shall be determined based on a comprehensive judgment of a review of the applicant's master's degree thesis or a suitable alternative, the academic performance of the school they came from, the results of other documents screening and oral exam and so on.
- (4) Applicants who have obtained or expected to complete a master's or professional degree at the Graduate School of Medicine, The University of Tokyo between 1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024 (NOTE1)

are exempted from the primary exam.

Applicants who have obtained a master's or professional degree at the Graduate School of Medicine, The University of Tokyo between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2023 (NOTE2) are exempted from Foreign-Language assessment of the primary exam.

Note 1: Those who wish for October 2024 entry, consider "1 October 2023 and 30 September in 2024" instead of "1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024."

Note 2: Those who wish for October 2024 entry, consider "1 October 2021 and 30 September 2023" instead of "1 April 2021 and 31 March 2023.

5. Announcement of successful applicants & admission procedures

- (1) Announcement of successful applicants
 A list of successful applicants will be posted on the website (http://www.m.u-tokyo.ac.jp/index.html) on 12:00 p.m. Fri, 9 Feb 2024.
- (2) An Admission Certificate will be posted to each successful applicant in late February 2024.
- (3) Admission Certificate recipients are required to complete the necessary admission procedures (i.e., payment of admission fees and submission of admission forms) in accordance with the accompanying Admissions Guide as follows.
 - applicants for April 2024 entry: within designated period on early-March, 2024
 - applicants for October 2024 entry: within designated period on late September, 2024

Failure to complete the admission procedures shall be regarded as refusal of admission.

- (4) Estimated costs of admission in 2024
 - (International students with a Japanese Government [Monbukagakusho] Scholarship are exempt from these fees)
 - ① Admission fee: ¥282,000 (estimated)
 - 2 Tuition fee: ¥260,400 (annual tuition fee of ¥520,800; estimated)

Note: The amounts indicated above are tentative. If amounts are amended at the time of admission or while the individual is registered as a student, the new amounts shall apply from the time of the amendment in question.

6. Application procedure

(1) Applicants must contact faculty member before applying.

Applications must be sent by postal mail.

Place all of the necessary application documents in a single envelope designated by the Graduate School of Medicine, and send by registered mail.

If the application documents cannot fit inside the designated envelope, place the documents together with the envelope in a suitably sized package and send by registered mail.

Graduate School of Medicine's Admission Office does not respond to inquiries on about individual delivery status. Each delivery status must be confirmed by tracking number on applicants' side.

(2) Submission period

Applications must arrive between Thursday, 4 January and Tuesday, 9 January 2024. The envelope must be postmarked no later than Tuesday 9 January 2024, and must arrive no later than Friday 12 January 2024.

(3) In case you live abroad and having a difficulty in submitting the application documents by post, you may submit them online.

Submission period would be Thursday, 4 January and Tuesday, 9 January 2024 JPT 23:59. However, when the postal mail becomes available, please submit the original application documents via postal mail immediately. Also, if you submit documents by both postal mail and online, we will presume the documents sent by postal mail as the final version.

7. Other important points

- (1) We will send you the examination card by post and notes on the examination by Email around the middle of January, 2024. If you have not received them by four days prior to the exam, contact the Administration Office (see 6(4) above) for instructions.
- (2) Following the submission of application documents, changes to the documents or the refund of exam fees will not be allowed under any circumstances. Once application documents are received, they are not returnable.
- (3) Those who wish to maintain their employment at a government office, school, hospital, or private company during enrollment are required to submit a consent form (format optional) from their employer when completing the admission procedures (see 5(3)) above, to the effect that they will enter our school maintaining the employment.
- (4) International students are required to obtain the appropriate visa according to the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act (Cabinet Order No. 319 of 1951) prior to undertaking the admission procedures.
- (5) Admission fees shall not be refunded under any circumstances following the completion of admission procedures.
- (6) Applicants with a physical disability who require special consideration or assistance during the entrance exam or after enrollment should contact the Administration Office (see 6(4) above) when submitting their application.
- (7) Names, addresses, or other personal information obtained from applications will only be used for: ① screening of applicants (application processing & screening); ② the announcement of successful applicants; and ③ tasks related to admission procedures. This personal information will also be used for: ① academic affairs (enrollment records, learning etc.); ② student support (health management, employment assistance, applications for scholarships and exemption from tuition fees, use of libraries, etc.); and ③ collection of tuition fees.
- (8) If any false statement or forgery in the application documents, or if there is clear evidence that there was any fraudulent activity during the examination, that student's admittance may be canceled even after enrolling in or going on to a graduate school.
- (9) The examination results used in the selection of entrants may be used in future studies for the

improvement of both the entrance examination and the education at the University of Tokyo.

(10) The University of Tokyo has established the "The University of Tokyo Security Export Control Regulations" in accordance with Japan's "Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act", and rigorously implements security export control for potential students before and after their enrollment on the basis of these regulations. In particular, pre-enrollment screenings are mandatory for all international students and also for Japanese students in certain circumstances. Please be aware that applicants who fall under any of the conditions set out in the Act may not receive permission to enroll at the university or may have their research activities restricted after their enrollment even if they have passed the entrance examinations.
